THE CRIB: In 1223 when most ordinary people could not read, St. Francis decided he would demonstrate the Christmas story in a way everyone could understand. He set up a stable scene in a cave not far from his home in Assisi, with real people and animals. As people gathered around to see what he was doing, he told them how Jesus had been born in a simple stable and how angels had appeared to shepherds telling them to go and find for themselves the Messiah who had been born. Now 800 years on from the first Christmas crib scene in history the tradition is passed on in homes and communities across the world bringing with it a message of hope and peace which never fades away.
