FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT (LAETARE SUNDAY)

SEEING OUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL: Luke 15:1-3,11-32

The two clear lessons from today's Gospel are:

- 1. I can be absolutely sure of God's mercy and forgiveness, provided I turn back to him in true sorrow.
 2. I need to have the same attitude of compassion with people who offend me. I must be ready to forgive and be reconciled. I cannot refuse to love someone that God loves.
- There are three people in this story and we can identify with all of them:
- The son who went far from his Father and followed his own way in the most degrading behaviour.
- The son who thought he was good and observant, but deep down did not have the mind of his Father at all. He kept the commandments and all the rules but did not have a forgiving heart.
- The father whose love never changes no matter what his children do and is ready to accept them back every time without exception.

Which of these most represents me? Which one would I want to be like? Many say they identify most with the elder son, which of course is the point of the story. They who are the real sinners are those who shut their hearts against Gods Compassionate love.
